"I don't know politics but I know the names Of those in power, and can repeat them like Days of week, or names of months, beginning with Nehru. I am Indian, very brown, born in Malabar, I speak three languages, write in Two, dream in one."

The above lines shows that women are not allowed entering politics. She does not know politics but she is able to say all the politics. She can repeat it like the names of days and months. The important information which she wants to convey is that she is unable to live her life with her wishes.

"Why not leave Me alone, critics, friends, visiting cousins, Every one of you? Why not let me speak in Any language I like? The language I speak,"

Immediately in the next stanza she conveys it very clearly that to free her from all the rules and regulations of the critics and the other fellow men. Men forget the values of women. She makes very clear questions to the critics, friends, and visiting cousins, why do not you men allow me to live the life which I like to live. In every aspects the surrounding men decides her life, even in small aspects like speaking the language, wearing the dress, etc...

"When I asked for love, not knowing what else to ask For, he drew a youth of sixteen into the Bedroom and closed the door, He did not beat me But my sad woman-body felt so beaten. The weight of my breasts and womb crushed me. I shrank Pitifully."
